Be yourself more with skill

The challenge is to balance being your **authentic self** with the requirements of the culture and context that you're leading in.

Being able to adapt within an acceptable bandwidth is an important skill to practice.

To develop your relationships at work:

- K What would you need to do differently?



Detect other people's motives

We tend to assume that our most important motives are shared by others. This can create a disconnect with affects team performance and progress.

Understanding other people's motives provides insights to inform effective leadership.

Ask yourself:

- Whose performance matters to your progress?
- What motivates them?
- K How could you help them?



Practice situation-sensing

In leadership, we can become too task-oriented and forget to look around and observe what is happening in our every day.

Taking the time to observe our daily events (*like social anthropologists*) increases self-awareness and adaptability.

Set aside pockets of time in your day to do one-minute mindmaps. Record first impressions of who, what, where and what you've learnt.
